2020-21 Midweek Skiing Protocol

- 1. Club members will need to make their own ski or parking reservations as require by each resort. The schedule for midweek skiing is contained in the calendar included monthly in the FSC newsletter.
- 2. Please contact Ed Hanson via email, ewhfgh@cs.com, or cell phone, 303.902.3709 by Saturday, if you plan to ski on Mondays.
- 3. Please contact Rich Evertz via email, h2ocoachre@msn.com, or cell phone, 303.709.3276, by Tuesday if you plan to ski on Thursdays.
- 4. Carpools will have to be arranged by individual members. Ed and Rich will have a list of participants, if any are available, on Sundays and Wednesdays, for those people who are looking for a carpool. Contact Ed or Rich no later than Saturday or Tuesday, by 6 pm, if you are looking for a carpool.
- 5. It is strongly recommended that drivers and riders follow CDC guidelines and wear face masks/socially distance when possible in carpools. Having slightly open windows for air ventilation and using hand sanitizer, per your driver's request, would also be helpful. If there is only one rider in a carpool, please reimburse your driver accordingly.
- 6. There will be no general meet-up location for carpoolers, as there has been in years' past. If you want to arrange for a meet-up location for your individual carpool, please do so.
- 7. Ed and Rich will offer, via email, meet-up locations in the morning and for lunch for the area you will be skiing that day.



WINTER Skiing in CRESTED BUTTE
3 Nights Lodging at the CRISTIANA GUESTHAUS
Jan. 22nd, 23rd & 24th (leaving Jan. 25th AM)



Several spaces remain on the Crested Butte trip. A description of the trip appears in the October newsletter. Total trip cost is \$380 per person.

Final payment of \$330.00, for those who paid a deposit, is due on December 3rd by mail. Make checks payable to the Flatirons Ski Club, write 2021 Winter Crested Butte on the memo line, and send to Linda and Chris Paris (home address). **Please call or e-mail with questions.** Extra rooms will be returned to the Cristiana after the payment deadline the first week of December.

Reservation and lift arrangements are on your own. Persons going on this trip should be making reservations to downhill ski now. So far, Gunnison County is maintaining its COVID restrictions at the same blue level in place since June. You must be willing to abide by all COVID regulations in force in order to come on this trip. Mask wearing and social distancing will be required of all participants. We are not assuming regulations will be lifted by the end of January.

Snowy Range Ski Trip

Wednesday, February 3rd - Thursday, February 4th Checkout - Friday February 5th (2 nights)

Snowy Range Trip is one of the most popular Flatirons ski trips for a number of reasons. It is probably the least expensive trip and easiest to drive to. Lift tickets are only \$49 on the 4 chair lifts and there are **free lift tickets** for members 70 years and older. Cross-country ski trails are

in the area. 2 nights in a double room are only \$96 with walking distance to restaurants. The drive is only about 2 hours with no mountain passes and no mountain driving. 32 FSC members have already paid the \$30 deposit. Another room can be reserved if 2 roommates sign up. **Trip Leader: Stew Woodward**

Leadville Ski Trip

Tuesday and Wednesday - February, 9th and 10th, 2021

For this year's Leadville trip, we again have reservations at the Columbine Inn, 2019 N. Poplar, Leadville, 80461. Phone: 719.486.5650. The cost is \$135 each for 2 nights sharing a double room - the deposit is \$25 and the balance is due Jan 10, 2021. It is possible at this time to book extra rooms if needed. As of today there are some adjustments which may change by February. The breakfast room at this point will be closed – coffee will be available in the lobby. There are fridges and microwaves in all rooms – suggest taking simple breakfast items and eating in the room.

Ski Cooper will be open, and if you are 75 plus or have a season pass at Loveland, skiing here is Free. (Loveland Senior Season Pass is only \$99) Day tickets for Ski Cooper will need to be pre-ordered on line as there will be a limited number of tickets available each day – prices have not yet been announced. Also, at the present time the lodge may be closed this coming season. Hopefully there will be some change or adaptation by February – stay tuned! As an alternative for downhill skiers Copper Mountain is only 30 minutes away and several members enjoy skiing that area with the IKON pass.


For cross country skiers or snow shoers there is the Mineral Belt Trail which loops through Leadville, crossing Harrison Ave just North of town at 12th St. Also close by is The Tennessee Pass Nordic Center (719.486.1750). No reservation is needed at this point and you can access a Trail Map on line.

Closer to trip time I will issue a list of local restaurants in Leadville, of which there are many, with indications whether they do take out, delivery or solely eat in. Many of these do offer pick up or delivery.

It will soon be time to get out!



BOOK: The Undoing Project: A Friendship that Changed Our Minds by Michael Lewis

Forty years ago Israeli psychologists Daniel Kahneman and Amos Tversky wrote a series of breathtakingly original studies undoing our assumptions about the decision-making process. Their papers showed the ways in which the human mind erred systematically when forced to make judgments about uncertain situations. Their work created the field of behavioral economics, revolutionized Big Data studies, advanced evidence-based medicine, led to a new approach to government regulation, and made much of Michael Lewis' own work possible. Kahneman and Tversky are more responsible than anybody for the powerful trend to mistrust human intuition and defer to algorithms.
