### Thursday Hikes May 2023

We continue to meet on Thursdays at the Meadows Shopping Center. We meet at 8:45 and leave at 9:00. People can carpool from the Meadows Shopping Center, or they can drive by themselves to the trailhead. The Meadow Shopping Center is at the southwest corner of Foothills Highway and Baseline. # **TUESDAY EVENING HIKES - MAY 2023**

Due to other club activities the evening hikes will start on May 16<sup>th</sup>. Please arrive a little before 6 p.m. so the hikes can start promptly. Bring a dish to share, your own tableware, water, and drink.

Note: Location of potluck is at trailhead or private home.

### <u>May 16</u> - Coordinator is Louisa Young. Urban hike through Knollwood neighborhood.

Park on Pearl Street near Louisa's house at 287 Pearl. If there is nothing on the street go to the parking lot at People's Crossing (northwest of intersection of Pearl and Canyon) and walk back east 2 long blocks. The hike will go through a narrow canyon with interesting features, then through the Knollwood neighborhood ending at Sunshine Canyon Road (Mapleton). Return along sidewalks to Louisa's home for a potluck.

## May 23 - Coordinators are Jody Hughes and Marty DeSantis. Coalton Trail – out and back

1 to 2 miles each way, turn back when you want. A wide dirt road with some elevation gain after the first mile. Optional is the Meadowlark Trail from the same trailhead. Potluck at the trailhead afterwards. Picnic tables and restrooms are at the trailhead.

<u>Directions</u>: From Hwy 36 and McCaslin – go 2 miles South on McCaslin to the second traffic circle at the west end of Coalton. Go ¼ around the circle then right into the parking and trailhead. From Hwy 128 and McCaslin go North on McCaslin 1.5 miles to the traffic circle, go ¾ around then right into parking.

Meet at Walden Ponds where we will hike, and afterwards have our potluck at the covered shelter (rain or shine).

# FSC Book Club

BOOK:	Cheap Land Colorado: Gridders at America's Edge
	by Ted Conover

In May 2017, Ted Conover went to Colorado to explore firsthand a rural way of life that is about living cheaply on your own land—and keeping clear of the mainstream. The failed subdivisions of the enormous San Luis Valley make this possible. Five-acre lots on the high prairie can be had for five thousand dollars, sometimes less. Conover volunteered for a local group trying to prevent homelessness during the bitter winters. He encountered an unexpected diversity: veterans with PTSD, families homeschooling, addicts young and old, gay people, people of color, lovers of guns and marijuana, people with social anxiety—most of them spurning charity and aiming, and sometimes failing, to be self-sufficient. And more than a few predicting they'll be the last ones standing when society collapses. Conover bought his own five acres and immersed himself for parts of four years in the often-contentious culture of the far margins. He found many who dislike the government but depend on its subsidies; who love their space but nevertheless find themselves in each other's business; who are generous but wary of thieves; who endure squalor but appreciate beauty.

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WILD ANIMAL SANCTUARY - KEENESBURG, CO. (Aiming for:) Thursday May 4th, 2023 (Alternate date in case of bad weather:) Monday May15th

You will purchase your ticket at the Welcome Center the day of the event.

Entry fee: Age 70+	\$20.
Age 14-69	\$50.
Age 3-13	\$30.

There is an elevated walkway that is a total of 3 miles in length (RT: out & back). A Snack area is on the walkway. They have a cafe where we can have lunch at the Welcome Center. However, they are often busy at lunchtime, with a wait as long as 30-45 minutes. So, we have an option of going back to Hudson (6 miles) to dine together at the Pepper Pod Restaurant at 12:30.

# 2023 Crested Butte Wildflower Trip, Tuesday, July 11 – Friday, July 14, 2023

Linda and Chris Paris will lead a Wildflower Rambles trip to Crested Butte next July 11 – 14, 2023 - 3 nights lodging at the Cristiana Guesthaus on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, checking out Friday morning. Note that this trip is earlier in July than it has been in past years and has been moved to midweek. Total trip cost is \$385.00 per person in a double occupancy room or \$525.00 per person in a single occupancy room.

The Cristiana provides breakfast each morning. Provide your own lunch with items brought from home in a small cooler or purchased locally. Dinners will be at local restaurants. The trip cost covers only lodging with breakfast.

The trip leaders will lead a hike on both Wednesday and Thursday. Participants are welcome to join them or go out on their own. Options for wildflower walks and hikes are numerous, ranging from easy to moderate walks in/near town to strenuous hiking to mountain passes. People going on the trip should be in good physical health and condition. You must be vaccinated against COVID and a club member with signed waiver, per FSC policy.

A <u>non-refundable</u> deposit of \$75.00 <u>per person</u> is required at the time of sign-up – sign up can be either at the May 3rd meeting or by mail. Sign-up and checks will be accepted starting <u>at the end</u> of the May 3rd FSC Membership Meeting. Signing up is for those who are ready to <u>commit</u> to go on the trip. If you have some interest in going but are not sure, still thinking about it (for COVID, schedule or other reasons), or your schedule may change, put your name on the waiting list – no deposit is required to join the waiting list. Before you sign up and pay a deposit, <u>be sure</u> you are ready to come on the trip. There are accommodations for 19 people: 3 couples (king), 10 persons in 5 queen+double rooms (each with own bed) and 3 single persons (queen). Queen+Double rooms are only for double occupancy - 2 persons who are comfortable rooming with each other and mutually agree to do so. Sign up together after you have found your roommate. Persons to contact to arrange a roommate can be suggested by the trip leaders, if you don't have

someone in mind, however, finding a roommate is ultimately your own responsibility. Questions? Contact Linda and Chris by e-mail/telephone.

We will look out for your check in the mail and inform you when we receive it. **Make out checks to Flatirons Ski Club and put 2023 Wildflower Crested Butte in the note line**. ## **2023 Wildflower Rambles**

Good snows occurring now mean good flowers this summer. The Wildflower Rambles will continue last year's "as we go" protocol of developing an interest list of participants. A date, destination, and meet-up information will be provided through an e-mail to the interest group list. If you are interested in participating this summer, please drop Linda Paris an e-mail so we can form that interest list. Even if you were on the list last year, please email us again to confirm you wish to continue being notified. An indication of what you are comfortable doing or specific places that would appeal for rambling are welcome. Would you like to see something special (for example calypso orchids)? The rambles leader core met recently and developed local trips through the end of June. More detailed information about place/time, leaders, meet up for carpooling and other details will be sent out through the interest list.

The early season trips through June are:

# May 3: U.S. 36 at Neva Road and optional 6-Mile Fold (focus on endangered Bell's Twinpod)

May 19: Centennial Trail (focus on Sugarbowls)

## June 7: Golden Gate State Park (focus on Calypso Orchids)

# June 12: Shanahan Ridge (focus on penstemons, especially Bluemist that blooms in profusion at Shanahan)

Wildflower rambles are relaxed and slow-paced trips to allow attention to the details of the flowers and plants and to make identification easier. We also spotlight particular flower groups. Bring sun protection, snack/lunch, water, rain gear and field guides. There is a carpool fee payable to the driver.

The rambles leader team of 6 welcomes everyone who likes to look for or wants to find out more about flowers. We recognize that there are many levels of expertise and pace among our ramblers and also recognize that we will get strung out on our route because of that. Some want general information about the flowers and others are into keying them out. Rambles are not meant to be hikes. Our rambles policy is to provide several leaders to accommodate faster, moderate, and ambling paces. You are welcome to go as far as your interest or physical condition take you.

## August 15, 16 and 17, 2023 10th Mountain Division Hut Trip

Arrangements have been made to go to the Ben Eiseman Hut, 3 nights this time. It is near Vail. Spend a couple of days unplugged from electronics – no TV or radio. Cell phone service may not exist either.

Sign-ups will continue at the May 3rd General Meeting. The cost will be \$125 per person. \$25 deposit holds your place, with the balance due June 15<sup>th</sup>. Volunteers will be solicited to prepare and clean-up breakfast and dinners. You need to bring your own hike lunches. Mattresses and pillows are provided. Most are bunk beds.
