FSC General Meeting program for January 3rd How to Stay Safe and Avoid Collisions on Today's Ski Hill

What can you do to make sure that you have a fun and safe day every time you hit the slopes? It can be a bit unnerving at times, with more crowded ski runs and some skiers/riders who may not be aware of their obligations under the Skier and Snowboarder Responsibility Code. But there are things you can do to improve your own safety, as well as that of others on the hill.

A Copper Mountain Safety Patrol (MSP) long-time member and Team Leader, Dwight Hill, will share actions that you can take to avoid getting hurt on the ski hill this season. He'll talk about planning your ski day and preparing yourself to have a fun and safe day, as well as the useful strategies MSP members learn and practice every day to keep themselves and others safe.

Copper Mountain Safety Patrol is a one-of-a-kind program that trains and provides volunteers to slow down skiers/riders on the 2 family runs at Copper Mountain; educate guests about safe skiing/riding; assists ski patrol with injured guests; and provide a wide variety of guest services to the skiing and riding public.



Suggested Carpool Fees for FSC Overnight Ski Trips 2024

After conferring with trip leaders and the Board, we did not feel it necessary to change the suggested carpool fees for this season's FSC overnight ski trips. These fees are loosely based on gas prices at \$3.50/gallon and a suggested carpool fee of 7 cents/mile, but keep in mind that driving incurs wear and tear on the car and can be stressful for the driver! They are guidelines only, and subject to change if recently volatile gas prices settle at a higher level.

Notes:

- The carpool fees above do not include daily driving to the ski areas or restaurants from the lodging.
 These need to be figured out separately.
- Take into consideration the number of people who are in the car.
- Pricing is ultimately at the discretion of the driver and the type of vehicle in use.
- To avoid misunderstandings, discuss carpool fees prior to your trip departure.

Also, please be mindful of deadlines. Our trip leaders work extremely hard to line up lodging and need to make deposits and final payments in a timely manner. If there are ANY changes to your trip plans, please notify the trip coordinators as soon as possible. If a room is reserved for you and you cancel, often it is difficult to get that room deposit returned. The earlier your cancellation, the better the chance of finding a replacement.

Hi everyone,

A friend of mine (not in FSC) was badly injured at Copper Mountain this month. Another skier collided with him from behind and he suffered a shattered shoulder. The other skier did call the ski patrol, gave them his contact info, and expressed his apologies. My friend had surgery and now has an artificial shoulder and a 4-month recovery. He thinks he might never ski again because if he reinjures that shoulder, another surgery would be difficult and risky. Therefore, I want to give a few more tips to prevent collisions, some of which were told to me by Copper Mountain Safety Patrol.

They said unless you are straightlining down the mountain (which is not safe), look around as often as possible to know if someone is close. Remember, snowboarders have a blind side and can't see a lot of others on the hill. If you are making wide turns, look before you turn. Stop where you are visible. Make sure your ski edges are sharp so you can turn and stop quickly if the snow is hardpacked or icy. As much as possible, think about letting others go in front instead of behind you. If you are passing someone and are close, call loudly "on your left" or "on your right".

The Copper Mountain Safety patrol will do a presentation on skiing safety at the next general meeting on Wednesday January 3. Please come with suggestions and comments about safety on the slopes, especially if you have had others collide with you.

Steamboat Springs Trip January 22 to 25, 2024

The club will be staying once again at the **Homewood Suites by Hilton**. I think last time everyone was happy with the comfortable accommodation. They provide a hot breakfast that includes eggs, hot and cold cereals, different breads, and pastries. We will be able to use the breakfast room for our happy hour gatherings as well. The town shuttle bus, which goes to the mountain and downtown, has a stop outside the front door of the hotel. Rooms all have two queen size beds, microwaves, TV's, coffee makers, and hairdryers.

There is an indoor hot tub, exercise room, and ping pong. We will be staying three nights - Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, checking out on Thursday - January 22 - 25, 2024!

The cost per person for the three nights with double occupancy is \$475. For those needing a single, the price is double that. Sign up for the trip and pay the total cost ASAP— rooms can still be added.

Monarch Mountain & Wolf Creek Jan. 30 - Feb. 2, 2024

Please join us for our third *combined* Flatirons Ski Club trip to Monarch and Wolf Creek from January 30 to February 2, 2024! We will have a *three-night* stay at The Baymont by Wyndham in Salida. You can travel to the ski area of your choice, Monarch Mountain, or Wolf Creek. Salida has many lovely restaurants to choose from for our dining pleasure. The drive to Monarch is less than 30 minutes up Highway 50 on Monarch Pass. Wolf Creek Ski area is two hours, mostly on a flat stretch of Highway 285. You can opt for either area.

Our stay at The Baymont hotel will include:

- * Spacious rooms with two comfortable queen beds
- * Continental breakfast + (with scrambled eggs)
- * Room amenities include big-screen TV, desk/chair, *mini-fridge, micro-wave,* coffee/tea maker, hair dryers, ironing board.
- * Indoor swimming pool and hot tub; Business center and laundry facilities.

The total cost per person for all three nights (double room occupancy) is \$200. Deposit is \$40. The balance was due at the December 6th FSC meeting. Single occupancy is \$375 for 3 nights.

<u>Cross-Country Skiers Note</u>: There are seven cross-country ski areas on Monarch Pass: Fosses Creek; Middle Fork Creek to Lost Wonder Hut; Waterdog Lakes etc. Also, Browns Creek (midway between Salida and Buena Vista) is a flat easy cc area to navigate. Contact Donna for more details.

A social gathering with appetizers will be held each night (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday). Please bring your favorite appetizer to share. Paper products and non-alcoholic beverages will be provided. BYOB if desired.

Day price for skiing at Monarch (<u>discounted from last year!</u>):

SNOW MOUNTAIN RANCH YMCA OF THE ROCKIES February 5 - 8, 2024

Snow Mountain Ranch (SMR) in Fraser is a wonderful location for cross country skiing with miles of groomed trails. Snow Mountain Ranch offers snowshoeing, swimming, roller skating, arts & crafts, cross country skiing, and many other activities. Downhill skiing is located nearby at Winter Park, Mary Jane, and Granby Ranch. Cross country skiing also is available at Devil's Thumb and other sites nearby to Snow Mountain Ranch.

The accommodation includes two reunion cabins with seven bedrooms. The trip fee includes use of most of the YMCA facilities, meals, and lodging. Trip attendees prepare the group meals at the cabins, and food is available to take for lunch. The trip fee includes SMR trail pass, meals, and lodging.

If the two cabins are full and additional members want to join this trip, it may be possible to reserve lodge rooms for the overflow.

Snowy Range 2024 February 20-22 (2 Nights)

Snowy Range Ski Area is beautifully nestled within the scenic Medicine Bow National Forest in southeast Wyoming. There's downhill skiing as well as many trails for cross country skiing. It's an easy drive with no mountain passes or tunnels to navigate and it's only about 2 1/2 hours from Boulder!

We will stay at the rustic and charming Old Corral Hotel which is in Centennial WY (2750 Hwy 130). The Old Corral Hotel is only 4 miles away from the ski area, which is really convenient. The trip fee of \$102 per person is based on double occupancy, and it includes 2 queen size beds, with mini fridge (microwaves are available in the common area). The hotel is within a 5-minute walk to Mountain View Café or Bear Bottom Bar & Grill, very handy for dinner or breakfast.

There are usually few people skiing mid-week at Snowy Range and it's a nice change of pace. Another really great thing is the price of the day ticket (18-69yrs) is only \$49 (last season) and everyone 70+ is free! So please join us as we ski Snowy Range Ski Area, Wyoming, 2024.
