
Message from the President

Program for General Meeting April 3, 2024 Skiing Off to War with the 10th Mountain Division Presented by Flint Whitlock of the Broomfield Veterans Museum

The 10th Mountain Division, which trained in Colorado from 1942-1944, was the last U.S. division to go overseas. Once deployed to the mountains of Italy, it never lost a battle or gaveup a foot of ground. After the war, many of the veterans returned to the U.S. to kick-start the ski industry and establish many ski areas such as Vail and Aspen — and create the 10th Mountain Hut System. Arrangements have been made to go to Jay's Cabin at Shrine Mountain August 18, 19 and 20 of 2024. It is located near Vail Pass, and it is accessible with regular vehicles. This one is uptown! IT HAS POTABLE WATER, FLUSH TOILETS, REFRIGERATOR AND SHOWERS!!! Spend a couple of days unplugged from electronics – no TV or radio. Cell phone service may not exist either. The bed configuration is different from past events. There are 8 single beds, 1 queen and 1 double. So we can accommodate 2 couples and 8 singles. SUMMER WILDFLOWERS in CRESTED BUTTE

2024 Crested Butte Wildflower Trip, Tuesday, July 9 - Friday, July 12, 2024

Linda and Chris Paris will lead a Wildflower Rambles trip to Crested Butte next July 9 – 12, 2024 - 3 nights lodging at the Cristiana Guesthaus on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, checking out Friday morning. Note that this trip is earlier in July than it has been in past years and is now midweek. **Total trip cost is \$412.00 per person in a double occupancy room or \$552.00 per person in a single occupancy room**. Deposits for the trip will be accepted beginning April 3.

The Cristiana provides breakfast each morning. Provide your own lunch with items brought from home in a small cooler or purchased locally. Dinners will be at local restaurants. The trip cost covers only lodging with breakfast.

The trip leaders will lead a wildflower hike on both Wednesday and Thursday. Participants are welcome to join them or go out on their own. Options for wildflower walks and hikes are numerous, ranging from easy to moderate walks in/near town to strenuous hiking to mountain passes. People going on the trip should be in good physical health and condition. Being vaccinated for COVID, flu and RSV is strongly encouraged.

A non-refundable deposit of \$75.00 per person is required at the time of sign-up – either at the April meeting or by mail. Sign-up and checks will be accepted at the end of the April 3 FSC Membership Meeting. Signing up is for those who are ready to commit to go on the trip. If you have interest in going but are not sure, still thinking about it, or your schedule may change, put your name on the waiting list – no deposit is required to join the waiting list. Before you sign up and pay a deposit, be sure you are ready to come on the trip.

Our reservations accommodate 26 people: 5 couples (king), 10 persons in 5 queen+double rooms (each with own bed) and 6 single persons (queen). Queen+Double rooms are only for double occupancy - 2 persons who are comfortable rooming with each other and mutually agree to do so. Sign up together after you have found your roommate. Contact the trip leaders for suggestions of persons to contact to arrange a roommate if you don't have someone in mind. Finding a roommate is your own responsibility. Questions? Please contact us by e-mail to let us know you have chosen to sign up by mail. We will look for your check in the mail and inform you when we receive it. **Make out checks to Flatirons Ski Club and put 2024 Wildflower Crested Butte in the note line**. Send deposits and final payments to the Paris' by mail (address available from the membership list). **Full payment is due by Saturday, June 1, 2024.** After that date, unused rooms will be cancelled.

2024 Wildflower Rambles

The recent significant snow bolstered our watersheds and bodes well for a good flower season this summer. The Wildflower Rambles is using an "as we go" protocol and developing an interest list of participants for communication. If you are interested in participating this summer, please drop Linda Paris an e-mail so we can form that interest list. Even if you were on the list last year, please email us again to confirm you wish to continue being notified. An indication of what you are comfortable doing, specific places that would appeal for rambling or special flowers that interest you (for example calypso orchids) are welcome. The rambles leader core met recently and developed trips through July. Detailed information about place/time, leaders, meet up for carpooling, directions and trail attributes will be sent out by email to the interest list.

The early season trips in April and May are:

Joder Ranch from Old Stage Road
Rabbit Mountain near Lyons
Goshawk Ridge (focus on pasque flowers and sugarbowls)
Realization Point vicinity, Flagstaff Road

Wildflower rambles are relaxed and slow-paced trips to allow attention to the details of the flowers and plants and to make identification easier. We also spotlight particular flower groups. Bring sun protection, snack/lunch, water, rain gear, poles and field guides. There is a carpool fee payable to the driver.

The rambles leader team of 6 welcomes everyone who likes to look for or wants to find out more about flowers. We recognize that there are many levels of expertise and pace among our ramblers and also recognize that we will get strung out on our route because of that. Some want general information about the flowers and others are into keying them out. Rambles are not meant to be hikes. Our rambles policy is to provide several leaders to accommodate faster, moderate and ambling paces. You are welcome to go as far as your interest or physical condition take you. Please consider your physical capabilities/limitations, the ramble trip details (elevation, surface, topography, etc.) and your schedule in your decision to participate.

• Unless otherwise noted, carpools depart at 7:30 from Eldorado ParK "N" Ride on the northeast corner of Hwy 93 and Hwy 170 (sometimes called Marshall Rd). **Please arrive 10 minutes early to ensure an on-time departure.** Let Ed or Arnie know if you are willing to drive. We can also meet skiers at agreed upon times in the Wooly Mammoth lot in Golden.

Ski Safety

Unfortunately, some of our club members have had collisions with other skiers or snowboarders with some injuries resulting. In an effort to promote safety on the slopes, here are some of my suggestions, many of which come from Ski Patrol at various areas.

- Look around you on the slopes continuously. Be aware of others who are around you and approaching. Ski defensively.
- Remember that snowboarders have a blind spot and often don't see other people on the hill.
- Leave yourself an out. Try to keep lots of space between yourself and other skiers and snowboarders.
- Try not to do wide sweeping turns that others can't anticipate. A straighter line down the mountain with tighter turns at controlled speed is safer and easier for others to avoid.
- In flat light or when it's snowing and visibility is not great, the visibility and ability to see moguls, bumps, and contours in the slope is better near the trees and in glades.
- When skiing near the side of a trail, keep a constant lookout for others suddenly emerging from the trees unannounced.
- When others are coming up behind you, stop and wait for them to go in front of you to make it easier to see them.
- Don't ski alone in remote areas, trees, glades, etc. where medical help or rescuers may have a hard time finding you.
- Don't do that additional last run of the day if you're too tired.
- Keep your skis tuned because the powder can turn to hard pack, and you want sharp edges so you can turn and stop quickly and not slide.
- When you're coming up close on others, call out "on your right" or "on your left", or "behind you" loud enough so it can be heard through headphones.
- Keep your cell phone charged and turned on for emergencies and to communicate with your companions for meeting at the end of the day.
- Make sure all your companions have your cell # in their phones. Also, enter phone #'s for each area's Ski Patrol in your phones.
- If involved in a collision with others, the ski area safety act requires exchanging contact information. I recommend doing this even in the event of what you think is a minor collision because an injury can turn out to be worse than initially thought.
- Have fun and be safe on the slopes!
