BOOK: The Covenant of Water by Abraham Verghese

Description: Spanning the years 1900 to 1977, *The Covenant of Water* is set in Kerala, on South India's Malabar Coast, and follows three generations of a family that suffers a peculiar affliction: in every generation, at least one person dies by drowning—and in Kerala, water is everywhere. At the turn of the century, a twelve-year-old girl from Kerala's long-existing Christian community, grieving the death of her father, is sent by boat to her wedding, where she will meet her forty-year-old husband for the first time. From this unforgettable new beginning, the young girl—and future matriarch, known as Big Ammachi—will witness unthinkable changes over the span of her extraordinary life, full of joy and triumph as well as hardship and loss, her faith and love the only constants.

Thursday Hikes June 2024

For a few years, Sue Evans and Louisa Young have been planning and leading day hikes on Thursdays. We have decided to put our destinations in the newsletter. We reserve the ability to change without notice if the weather or other factors so motivate us. We hope this will help people in their decision whether to save a particular Thursday and commit to join us. We meet at the Meadows Shopping Center parking lot in the northeast area, near the office building at 7:45 and leave promptly at 8. Look for people standing by their cars. The Meadows is on the southwest quadrant of the corner of Baseline and Foothills Parkway. It's an option to drive yourself and meet at the trailhead but let us know your plan. Pay attention to the forecast and bring layers of clothing plus water and snacks. We are often out all day and stop for a picnic lunch along the way. We welcome newcomers.

September 5 – Coulson Gulch is located in between Big Elk Meadow and the Button Rock area west of Lyons. It is about 7 miles round trip. Spoiler alert: you start out going downhill, so at the end, you have to climb that hill when you are tired. Pace yourself.

September 12 – rescheduling of Butzel Hill. The trailhead is along Left-Hand Canyon Drive at the group of houses called Rowena. It's about 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles roundtrip, with some elevation gain.

September 19 – Blue Lake from Mitchell Lake trailhead in the Brainerd Lake area. It is 6 ½ miles, and one source says it's 1200 ft of elevation gain. The trail is considered moderate. We will have to get entry permits, so it will be important to respond if you are joining us. We will designate drivers for the permits.

September 26 – Switzerland Trail, west of Gold Hill. The exact section is still under consideration.

Fall Bicycle Ride in Grand County, CO September 3, 4, 5 & 6, 2024

Dear Fellow Cyclists,

We now have some openings in the Fraser house (Alpine Learning Center) near Tabernash. I have 12 people signed up to stay in the Fraser house now. We could handle More especially if you like sleeping on an upper bunk. See previous newsletters for more information about Fraser House

Directions: To reach the Alpine Learning Center, take US 40 through Tabernash. Turn left (south) on Grand County Route 5 (also called Pole Creek Golf Course Road) about 3 miles north of Tabernash. If you see a sign for Snow Mt. Ranch, you have gone one mile too far past the left turn. Immediately after turning on Grand County Route 5, turn right (west) on Grand County Route 521 (Marble Rd). After a short distance, Marble Rd divides into a circle drive with a number of houses located around the loop. It is best to take the left fork (Rd. 5212). The Alpine Center is on your right (north side of the road) about a quarter of a mile from the fork. Remember parking is limited and it is best to carpool for those staying overnight and visiting.

We have a potluck planned for the first night with the members of the trip staying at the center, Remember parking is limited and it is best to carpool for those staying overnight and visiting.
