

Book: "An Unfinished Love" by Doris Kearns Goodwin

Description:



The Doris and Dick Goodwin's (married for 42 years) last great adventure involved finally opening the more than three hundred boxes of letters, diaries, documents, and memorabilia that Dick had saved for more than fifty years. They soon realized they had before them an unparalleled personal time capsule of the 1960s, illuminating public and private moments of a decade when individuals were powered by the conviction they could make a difference; a time, like today, marked by struggles for racial and economic justice, a time when lines were drawn

and loyalties tested. Their expedition gave Dick's last years renewed purpose and determination. It gave Doris the opportunity to connect and reconnect with participants and witnesses of pivotal moments of the 1960s. And it gave them both an opportunity to make fresh assessments of the central figures of the time—John F.

Kennedy, Jacqueline Kennedy, Martin Luther King Jr., Robert Kennedy, Eugene McCarthy, and especially Lyndon Johnson, who greatly impacted both their lives. The voyage of remembrance brought unexpected discoveries, forgiveness, and the renewal of old dreams, reviving the hope that the youth of today will carry forward this unfinished love story with America.

Thursday Hikes January 2025

We meet at the Meadows Shopping Center parking lot in the northeast area, near the office building. For the winter we are changing our meeting time to 8:45 and plan to leave promptly at 9. Look for people standing by their cars. The Meadows is on the southwest quadrant of the corner of Baseline and Foothills Parkway. It's an option to drive yourself and meet at the trailhead but let us know your plan. Pay attention to the forecast and bring layers of clothing plus water and snacks. We are often out all day and stop for a picnic lunch along the way. We welcome newcomers. Here is the plan for the coming month. A reminder goes out on Sunday or Monday to an email list maintained by Louisa. Be sure to get yourself on that list for current information as we go along. We reserve the ability to change without notice if the weather or other factors so motivate us.

February 6 – Picture Rock at Heil Ranch. The trailhead is off of Highway 7 just outside of Lyons. Look for signs on the left (south) side of the road. It's 5.2 miles out and back with maybe 500 ft of elevation gain.

February 13 – Big Bluestem is part of the Mesa Trail system and we will make a loop out of it. We start at South Boulder Creek Trailhead, which is on Highway 93, near Marshall Road. The total mileage is 4.3 with some elevation change, but not a lot. We tried to do this one last month but were deterred by wind.

February 20 – Flatirons Vista to Dowdy Draw and back is about 4 miles roundtrip, relatively flat most of the way. The trailhead is on Highway 93 south of Boulder. The views are spectacular. We tried this one in December but were deterred by mud.

February 27 – Teller Farm is about 6 miles out and back on an easy trail. The trailhead is located off of Arapahoe Road between 75th and 95th on the north side of the road.

FAC has been an FSC tradition for many years. Everyone is welcome. We meet at Rincon Cocina Y Tequila starting at 4:00 p.m. every Friday. The restaurant is on Arapahoe just west of the intersection of Folsom and Arapahoe. Hope to see you there.

Skiing Safely!

The slopes are getting more crowded and dangerous. We must do all we can to be safe on the slopes. Several additional pieces of advice I have learned from ski patrollers are:

- Keep your head on a swivel. Always look around to know if somebody's near you. Beware when even doing a slight traverse. I was nearly blindsided by a straight liner recently when only crossing the slope for a very short distance.
- When stopped, look uphill and wait for the slopes to clear before proceeding.
 Remember, a lot of people on the slopes may have had lessons in how to ski or
 snowboard, but not in how to be safe on the slopes and avoid others. I still
 remember what I learned in driver's education over 50 years ago: drive and ski
 defensively and leave yourself an out.
- When coming close to another skier or passing somebody, call out loudly "on your left" or "on your right"- same as while bicycling.

Also, we have a lot of potlucks and communal meals coming up with our ski trips. I have seen people in line for food, blow their nose or coughing into their hands, and then get back into line without washing their hands. If this is you, please wash your

hands again. Trip leaders, please keep hand sanitizer close by at mealtimes and remind people to wash their hands. I will help with these reminders when necessary. We don't want anyone to get sick. If you're not feeling good or have a communicable disease, please stay home.

Suggested Carpool Fees for FSC Overnight Ski Trips 2025

We did not think it appropriate to change the suggested carpool fees for this season's FSC overnight ski trips. These fees were loosely based on gas prices at \$3.50/gallon and a suggested carpool fee of 7 cents/mile, but keep in mind that driving costs have been driven up by inflation, and winter driving can stress both car and driver! They are guidelines only, and subject to change.

Notes:

- The carpool fees above do not include daily driving to the ski areas or restaurants from the lodging. These need to be figured out separately.
- Take into consideration the number of people who are in the car.
- Pricing is ultimately at the discretion of the driver and the type of vehicle in use.
- To avoid misunderstandings, discuss carpool fees prior to your trip departure.

Snow Mountain Ranch in Fraser is a wonderful location for cross-country skiing with miles of groomed trails. Snow Mountain Ranch offers snowshoeing, swimming, roller skating, arts & crafts, cross country skiing, and many other activities. The accommodation includes two reunion cabins with seven bedrooms.

Monarch Mountain & Wolf Creek February 18 to 21, 2025

Please join us for our fourth combined Flatirons Ski Club trip to Monarch and Wolf Creek from February 18 to 21, 2025. We will have a three-night stay at The Baymont by Wyndham in Salida. You can travel to the ski area of your choice, Monarch Mountain, or Wolf Creek. Salida has many lovely restaurants to choose from for our dining pleasure. The drive to Monarch is less than 30 minutes up Highway 50 on Monarch Pass. Wolf Creek Ski area is two hours, mostly on a flat stretch of Highway 285. You can opt for either area depending upon snow conditions, and your driving preferences.

Our stay at The Baymont hotel will include:

- * Spacious rooms with two comfortable queen beds;
- * Continental breakfast + (with scrambled eggs);
- * Room amenities include big-screen TV, desk/chair, mini-fridge, micro-wave, coffee/tea maker, hair dryers, and ironing board;
- * Indoor swimming pool and hot tub; and
- * Business center and laundry facilities.

The total cost per person for all three nights (double room occupancy) is \$175. Single occupancy is \$335 for 3 nights. If you haven't signed up and paid yet, please check with the trip leaders.

Cross-Country Skiers Note: There are 7 cross-country ski areas on Monarch Pass: Fosses Creek; Middle Fork Creek to Lost Wonder Hut; Waterdog Lakes, etc. Also, Browns Creek (midway between Salida and Buena Vista) is a flat easy area to navigate. Contact cross-country ski shops in Salida for more information.

A social gathering with appetizers will be held each night (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday). Please bring your favorite appetizer to share. Paper products and non-alcoholic beverages will be provided. BYOB if desired.
