General Safety Tips

Some club members are still skiing and others are hiking and biking now so here is what I have for Safety this month.

For skiing, be aware of changing conditions. This time of year, you can easily go in and out of the sun and shade numerous times on one run. The snow can be fast and then slow. Beware of snow that can grab your skis and stop your momentum and send you into a somersault. Keep your head on a swivel and always look around to see if

anybody is nearby. Use the buddy system and don't ski alone. Another tip I got from a ski patroller is, don't wear headphones while you're skiing. You want to be able to hear everybody who is near you. Keep your cell phones charged up and turned on so you can reach others in your Skiing and carpool group. Have fun and be safe on the slopes!

For biking, I recommend always wearing a helmet. Inspect your bike regularly to make sure the tires are good and the brakes are functioning properly. Use hand signals to communicate with other riders, when slowing down, stopping, or making turns. Call out when passing others.

For hiking, I recommend the buddy system and not hiking alone. I especially recommend a paper map, compass, and know how to use them. You can't always count on Internet access to be able to see a map on your phone. And don't hike trails or try to do distances beyond your ability and conditioning. I also recommend looking at **REI.com/The 10 essentials** to see recommendations on what to take with you while hiking.

KRISTIN HANNAH Women can be heroes. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these words; it is a revelation. Raised in the sundrenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself.

When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path. As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is over-whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a

gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets – and becomes one of – the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost.

But war is just the beginning for Frankie and her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam.

Thursday Hikes May 2025

We meet at the Meadows Shopping Center parking lot in the northeast area, near the office building. For the winter our meeting time is 8:45 and we plan to leave promptly at 9. Look for people standing by their cars. The Meadows is on the southwest quadrant of the corner of Baseline and Foothills Parkway. Our meeting area is east of Safeway. It's an option to drive yourself and meet at the trailhead but let us know your plan. Pay attention to the forecast and bring layers of clothing plus water and snacks. We are often out all day and stop for a picnic lunch along the way. We welcome newcomers.

Here is the plan for the coming month. A reminder goes out on Sunday or Monday to an email list maintained by Louisa. Be sure to get yourself on that list for current information as we go along. We reserve the ability to change without notice if the weather or other factors so motivate us.

- May 1 Rocky Flats NWR South Woman Creek and Woman Creek trail. It's open and sunny and about 4 miles, in and out. It has been recommended, but neither Ruth nor Louisa has hiked it, so it will be a new experience for all of us.
- May 8 Coney Flats Trailhead is at Beaver Reservoir. This is a high rocky trail, so it is weather dependent. We will go 2-3 miles in and then turn around. There is a lake, but it might be farther than we want to go.
- May 15 Snowshoe Hare loop in Golden Gate State Park is about 3 miles and there are optional additions along the way. Trailhead is at Aspen Meadows. We will be looking for drivers who have a State park entry pass. Or we can share the entry fee.
- May 22 Ceran St. Vrain. This is an old favorite located above Jamestown. It's about 4 miles out and back.

May 29 – Trailridge Road. It is a tradition to hike Trailridge Road in Rocky Mountain National Park before it is open to automobiles. Go as far as you like on the paved road and return.

There is a sign. Turn west and follow the road to the **shelter**, **bathrooms**, **and parking lot**.

Some want general information about the flowers and others are into keying them out. Rambles are not meant to be hikes. Our rambles policy is to provide more than one leader to accommodate moderate and ambling paces. You are welcome to go as far as your interest or physical condition take you. Please consider

your physical capabilities/limitations, the ramble trip details (elevation, surface, topography, etc.) and your schedule in your decision to participate.

10th Mountain Division Hut Trip Walter's Cabin at Shrine Mountain August 19, 20 and 21, 2025,



Walter's Cabin is located near Vail Pass, and it is accessible to regular vehicles. It's just a little way away from Jay's where we were last year. IT HAS POTABLE WATER, FLUSH TOILETS, REFRIGERATOR AND SHOWERS!!! Spend a couple of days unplugged from electronics – no TV or radio. Cell phone service may not exist either. The bed configuration is different from past events. There are 4 single beds and one double, on

each of the 2 floors, so 12 in total.

Sign-ups started at the April General Meeting, and the trip filled within 48 hours. There is no one on the waitlist, however, so put your name there if you really want to go. There are always cancellations. Volunteers will be solicited to prepare and clean-up breakfasts and dinners. You need to bring your own hike lunches. Mattresses and pillows are provided.

Southeast Colorado Historical Sites Trip: Bent's Old Fort National Historic Site, Amache National Historic Site and Sand Creek Massacre Site September 25 to 26, 2025

The club is proposing this overnight field trip to visit these three historical sites. We will carpool to Bent Fort (La Junta), a three hour and fifteen-minute drive from Boulder, and have the opportunity to walk a two-mile trail at the reconstructed site on the Arkansas River where hunters, trappers, and Natives peacefully traded with each other. This is on the old Santa Fe Trail, and the river was the boundary with Mexico. That afternoon we will drive to Amache where Japanese and Americans of Japanese ancestry were interned during WWII. Later that day we will check into a motel in nearby Lamar where rooms range from \$100 - \$150. On Friday before returning home, we will visit the Sand Creek Massacre National Historic Site. We will be able to enjoy a ranger-led tour and the three-mile interpretive trail. A ranger-led tour is available at Amache as well.
